June 20, 1990

Our relation to planning committee was discussed. Should there be slots for colleges to appoint representatives to the Council? Jean Stabel was asked to sit ex-officio with the Council as Five College Staff person.

There should be a membership ~~and~~ meeting in early September. Eleanor volunteered to schedule and plan this meeting.

The Special Events Committee has planned two events July 25 - Bus trip to Quechee Gorge, Vt. and St Gaudens Museum in New Hampshire. and August 15 - picnic at Hook Park, with opportunity for members to share

their travel experiences.

We agreed to continue to co-sponsor the World Affairs lectures.

Pat raised a question about "auditing" when repeating a course. No decision was made.

The meeting was adjourned.
