While Excel can be used for financial calculations and projections, it is also useful simply for keeping track of information that's in tables, thus functioning as a very simple database. In this workshop we will show you how to use Excel for keeping track of stuff. Janet uses it to keep track of her orchids. Jim uses it to keep track of stocks. Excel was used to keep track of registrations for the Civil War Sesquicentennial Symposium.

This will be a workshop for people who have never used Excel or a spreadsheet before and will cover things like making rows and columns the right size, pasting in information from some other source, and printing out the information you want.
