Open membership meeting and luncheon, 10/4/91

Barbara Southworth, president of LIR for 1991-92 presided. Southworth welcomed the members and especially greeted the new members who were attending a LIR event for the first time. She stated that our membership as of this date is 108 members, including 26 persons newly joined at this time.

Southworth described the structure, organization and function of 5CLIR briefly, and introduced the current officers and council members. Chairs of committees were then asked to speak briefly concerning the status of respective committees' work; each chair invited any and all members to join in committee work. Lawton stated that there are a few places remaining for persons to reserve for the October 18 trip to Worcester to visit the Art Museum there and the Armor museum. Navon sought an expression of membership interest in having LIR trips to Ballet and/or opera performances in Boston later in the year.

Southworth introduced the moderators of the Fall session seminars, and arranged for each moderator to meet with participants in his/her (?its?) seminar before lunch at this time.

Senders proposed a revision of our by-laws which will provide for a change in the method of nominating persons to the Council; the change will provide for persons in the Fall seminars as well as the Spring seminars, to submit nominations; an inadvertent omission had previously failed for by-laws to provide for this. The membership endorsed the amendment, and it was so ordered. The motion by Senders was seconded by Carl Swanson.

Virginia Senders, chair of Curriculum committee strongly urged persons to offer proposals for moderating spring session seminars.

Eleanor Reid, executive officer, reported on the status of enrollments and memberships, complimented the participation of members currently volunteering as office staff assistants.

Grace Rollason reported that the first assignment of LIR volunteers to the GREETERS corps for Fine Arts Center performances was effective, pleasant, well rewarded, and much appreciated by the Fine Arts Center management; Grace and Duncan Rollason served as greeters on October 3, 1991 for the Ray Charles concert.
